I know you only have time for one interview. 0:00:35.000,0:00:39.000 So in this interview, I'm going to ask you a little bit about your life 0:00:39.000,0:00:55.480 in Myanmar, before you moved to the United States, and then in the second part of today's interview, I will talk to you a little bit about your experience here in Montgomery County, and at Montgomery College, and about your plans for the future. 0:00:55.500,0:00:56.000 Okay? You did really good. 0:01:18.000,0:01:19.056 I'm trying. 0:01:19.056,0:01:20.000 Perfect. 0:01:21.000,0:01:36.000 So let's see, you were born in Yangon, Myanmar, and Yangon was formerly known as Rangoon, and Myanmar was known as Burma, and was renamed in 1989, I believe, is that right? 0:01:36.000,0:01:38.000 Yeah, that's correct.

Okay, and now you live with your aunt and uncle in Brookville, Maryland.

You moved to the United States in August of 2022.

So first of all, let's talk about your name.

How you chose the nickname "Matrix." I imagine that there is a story behind that.

Can you tell me a little bit about the city where you grew up? Tell us about Yangon.

So Yangon was once the capital city of, Myanmar,

and later then the Government decided to build a new city called Naypyidaw,

and then they name it like a capital city, but Yangon was the popular.. the most popular city
around the country,

and it's also a commercial city. So, all you can see, like all the people

walking at Yangon. It's really a crowded city.

Did you grow up in a big family?

my family,

my father, my mother, and my eldest sister and me.

So we are really a big, you know, big family. 0:07:24.581,0:07:29.963 And even though they are my cousins, we feel like we are a sibling to each other. 0:07:29.963,0:07:31.392 I see. 0:07:31.392,0:07:32.455 Yeah. 0:07:32.455,0:07:36.844 And did you grow up in an apartment building? What was your house like, where you grew up? 0:07:36.844,0:07:50.244 Oh, yeah, until, I think when I was yeah... since I was.. I was living in an apartment since I was born to, 0:07:50.244,0:07:52.659 I think, around 2015. 0:07:52.659,0:07:57.680 But after that my family bought a house, and then we moved to there 0:07:57.680,0:08:02.302 and then we lived there.. we lived there since then, yeah. 0:08:04.280,0:08:08.438 And can you tell me, one of the 0:08:08.438,0:08:13.643 photographs that you sent, which we will post, shows you wearing traditional clothing. Can you talk a little bit about that clothing, and how that reflects your culture? 0:08:18.431,0:08:26.557 Oh, yeah, I mean, you are talking about volunteering. I think, so.. 0:08:26.557,0:08:30.733 I remember when I was in high school, 0:08:30.733,0:08:38.399 whenever we have a good grade, I went to the monastery to volunteer. 0:08:38.399,0:08:48.409 A monastery is like a summer camp for the kids. So I volunteer in, you know, for the.. 0:08:48.409,0:08:53.457 for watching the kids, feeding the kids, or something like that, 0:08:53.457,0:08:55.794 and also 0:08:55.794,0:09:03.905 in our culture, we have to wear traditional clothes in a monastery, pagodas, or something like 0:09:03.905,0:09:10.675 I really loved to wear my traditional costume, because it is comfortable, 0:09:10.675,0:09:16.261 and it's really suitable with the weather also. 0:09:16.261,0:09:20.423 So you volunteered in a monastery where monks lived? 0:09:20.423,0:09:21.920

Yeah, yeah.

0:09:21.920,0:09:23.446 These were Buddhist monks? 0:09:23.446,0:09:31.744 Yeah. Buddhist monks. It was really a big. really big a compound where, you know, multiple buildings. 0:09:33.720,0:09:37.803 Is Buddhism very important in your home country? Are most people Buddhist? 0:09:38.800,0:09:40.833 Yeah, so.. 0:09:40.833,0:09:42.468 most of the majority of people 0:09:42.468,0:09:55.542 are Buddhism, so yeah, of course.. monks.. Buddhist monks have really, you know, a great influence on our people. 0:09:55.542,0:10:04.990 So we really, for example, from the aspect of religion, we have to respect them. 0:10:04.990,0:10:10.602 What is a really important holiday in your home country? 0:10:10.602,0:10:17.427 We have holidays in every month of the year, 0:10:17.427,0:10:28.787 but that most enjoyable and the most longest holiday was in April, I think, which was the Thingyan Festival. 0:10:28.787,0:10:37.346 So it is like the New Year, Burmese New Year. So we celebrate, as we welcome our New Year. 0:10:37.346,0:10:44.904 So during Thingyan festival, we splash water at each other, you know.. 0:10:44.904.0:10:52.776 It was really fun, and it was.. we celebrate for four days, yeah. 0:10:52.776,0:10:57.285 Did you say, part of the celebration is splashing water at each other? 0:10:57.285,0:10:57.832 Yup, yeah. 0:10:57.832,0:11:02.278 Can you talk a little bit more about that? Explain the meaning behind that? 0:11:02.278.0:11:19.297 Oh it's like.. so during Thingyan festival, it's going to be based on the timeline. So, since I.. when I was younger, there's no, you know, entertainment stage, or 0:11:19.297,0:11:27.841 you know, a really big stage to celebrate the water festival. So as kids, we have to.. 0:11:27.841,0:11:38.619 We have to carry the water bucket to the street, and so, whenever people pass the street, 0:11:38.619,0:11:44.839 we splash water, and then.. it's just like a tradition. They didn't get mad at us, you know, 0:11:44.839,0:11:48.605

people will.. people will splash you with water, and then you can't get mad at them.

because it is a tradition. During this period, you have to..

0:11:54.447,0:11:56.463 Then you get mad at them? 0:11:56.463,0:11:59.149 Yeah, as, you know, 0:11:59.149,0:12:09.752 in modern life.. modern timeline, there are a lot of entertainment places. People.. 0:12:09.752,0:12:20.080 A lot of companies built a really big stage, a really big compound, where people can, you know, play with water, dancing or enjoying, 0:12:20.080,0:12:21.499 something like that. 0:12:21.499,0:12:24.022 So, yeah, it was really fun. 0:12:24.022,0:12:26.923 It does sound fun to splash water at each other. 0:12:26.923,0:12:27.724 Yeah. 0:12:28.720,0:12:35.192 Were there traditional foods associated with this New Year Water Festival? 0:12:36.160,0:12:41.831 Yeah, that it's called 0:12:43.800,0:12:44.940 Mont Lone Yay Baw. 0:12:44.940,0:12:55.784 It mean.. it's just a, you know, like a round of wheat. I don't know how to describe it, but it will be better if I show you the picture. 0:12:55.784,0:12:58.717 Yeah, maybe send me a picture later, we can include that. 0:12:58.717,0:12:59.986 Yeah, yeah. 0:12:59.986,0:13:08.565 When you were growing up in your home country, you mentioned that you saw the movie Matrix, which, of course, a science fiction. 0:13:08.565,0:13:17.271 But did you see other movies or television series that had images of the United States in it? 0:13:17.271,0:13:22.314 Did you have an idea about the United States because of movies or television? 0:13:24.280.0:13:31.839 Yeah, I mean, in my country, we call it Hollywood movies. So they are really popular in my country, 0:13:31.839,0:13:35.549 and also, 0:13:35.549,0:13:40.340 I also like to watch the WWE. 0:13:40.340,0:13:48.000 Yeah, it's my though.. I could see the American flags in, you know, in every matches. So I..

It was Burma." 0:16:52.192,0:16:54.142 It was Burma, that's what people say, yeah. 0:16:54.142,0:17:01.389 One of the pictures you sent that I love is of some of the students in our class on the last day, 0:17:01.389,0:17:05.994 and when I looked at that photo, there are students from everywhere. 0:17:05.994.0:17:12.395 So since you've been at Montgomery College, have you had the chance to learn about other cultures, as well? 0:17:12.395,0:17:17.915 Yeah, of course! Here, we can see 0:17:17.915,0:17:22.884 people from.. a lot of people from different cultures. So, 0:17:22.884,0:17:34.940 in our class, I met with (Eric), who is from Bangladesh, also (Estrella) from Mexico, 0:17:34.940,0:17:42.552 and (Ayusha) from Nepal, I think. It's like there are a lot of people from different cultures. 0:17:42.552,0:17:47.553 So yeah, whenever we talk about it, it's like different cultural things 0:17:47.553,0:17:50.210 from our each own country. 0:17:50.210,0:17:54.308 So I learned a lot. 0:17:54.308,0:17:59.644 When you were in your home country, how old were you when you first started studying English? 0:17:59.644.0:18:05.884 So we have to study English, I think 0:18:05.884,0:18:09.774 in elementary school. Yeah! 0:18:09.774,0:18:13.339 So English has been the .. 0:18:13.339,0:18:22.462 Has been the major subject in elementary school, until through the graduate school, so 0:18:25.440,0:18:28.502 we have to learn English, 0:18:28.502,0:18:34.987

and then.. we have to learn only English subjects in University.

So we don't learn our own language in University.

You use English in University there?

Yeah.
0:18:42.906,0:18:47.269
Is it British English, because of the history of colonization?

Yeah, most of them are British English. Yeah!

But they.. I mean, we don't really

take serious about the British accent.

So when you came here, you had to take a placement test,

Yeah.
0:19:07.674,0:19:14.240
and you were placed into the ELAP program, English Language for Academic Purposes.

How did you feel about that, having to take English classes?
0:19:18.028,0:19:31.774
Oh, yeah. So, I took the IELTS test before I applied for the college in here. So I got 6.0 out
of 9.0.

I think, so, I had to speak with the counselor.. One of the counselors at MC. So we made an
online meeting.

And then she ask me some questions, and I answered, and then she said

"your English, is good, but I will put you in the ELAI 990 first," you know, if you..

A highest level class, the capstone course.

Yeah, yeah, yeah. That's why.

I'm okay with that, you know.
0:20:07.451,0:20:21.762
Actually, I was very happy about that, because I can see a lot of people from different
cultures, you know, who are also maybe freshman in college,
0:20:21.762,0:20:24.362
so we can share our experience.

So in that class, that's the capstone course, and for people who are not familiar with it,
there's reading, writing, speaking, and listening in that class. So it's a lot.

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And you use technology in that class, too, because you are creating digital stories.

So you were learning a lot. Did you feel like that class prepared you well for the credit level classes that you took after?

What differences did you notice between your experience going to university

in your home country and your experience going to college here at Montgomery College?

I mean, there are lot of differences. Because in my country,

whether we pass the.. we are.. whether we are qualified for the next year or no..

The guide in whether we are qualified for next year or not, is based only on our midterm and final exam.

So, yeah. They don't give us homework, you know, assignment points, quizzes.

So if you pass the midterm and final exam, you're good with it.

But in here, you have to..

you have to make effort in every..

every assignment, every quiz, because they give you different percentage for the grade.

So I have to take care of everything.

That is a big difference.

I had a question for you about.. related to the final project that you did in my class.

You spoke about the participating in demonstrations

that happened during a military coup in your country.

Can you tell us a little bit about what happened at that time, and your decision to participate in those demonstrations?

Yeah, so

0:22:52.685,0:23:01.284

our country was like a developing country, and now we could see a great potential for the future.

There are a lot of great opportunity for us, especially teenagers or graduates.

But unfortunately, there was an outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, and

0:23:15.516,0:23:24.745

once we recovered from the COVID-19, there was also another problem, which is the military coup.

So the military government take the country power, and detain the President and the other leaders.

Our current president was a President that we voted for.

So the military.. we don't really like the military government, but they control the country.

So we are not.. we are really frustrated about that and we are really angry.

So we started demonstrations and then protesting, I think, all over the country.

And can you tell me a little bit about what that was like? You mentioned in class that there were groups of teachers that were demonstrating, that there were students who are demonstrating, doctors, can you tell us about that experience?

Yeah, so, I mean, we made

0:24:29.008,0:24:42.635

a movement called, a Civil Disobedience Movement, CDM. CDM means Civil Disobedience Movement. It's like people who work in the government,

0:24:42.635,0:24:47.999

has.. who work in the government,

0:24:47.999,0:24:56.274

they didn't have to quit their job, but they just stopped working for the Government, for the military government.

0:24:56.274,0:24:57.543

They went on strike?

0:24:57.543,0:25:00.119

Yeah, they went on strike and a protest, yeah.

0:25:00.119,0:25:06.724

And what was it like for you? Was that the first time you had ever demonstrated in the streets? Had you done that before?

Yeah, it was the first. It was my first time, and then it was really all fine, you know.

0:25:14.857,0:25:19.869

At first, we just protested peacefully.

0:25:19.869,0:25:24.546

And then, we just went to our home, and the next day we protest again.

But, later then, the military started using leader weapon forces, like

0:25:32.018,0:25:34.760 real guns with real bullets, 0:25:34.760,0:25:43.174 not rubber bullets. And then teargas, and then, sometimes they used machine gun. 0:25:43.174,0:25:47.659 Were you afraid to participate because of that? 0:25:47.659,0:25:48.585 Yeah, I'm really 0:25:48.585,0:25:56.058 afraid of.. you know, when you are in a very crowded area, 0:25:56.058,0:25:58.925 you can't really escape from the bullet, you know. 0:25:58.925,0:26:09.387 So it was really horrifying. What happened at the end of the protest. Were they successful?
